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WHAT IS SOCIAL EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT?



Social emotional development is learning to manage and express feelings, create relationships, interact with others, and use self-control. Development of social and emotional skills begins in infancy, but continues as the child grows. Interactions at home and in childcare settings are important for development socially and emotionally. Caring for children in their most formative years is an important job. An understanding of what social emotional development is and what it means plays a vital role in how you care for and interact with children and their growth.

A Deeper Dive into Social Emotional Development

Social emotional development refers to a child's capacity to experience, manage, and express the full range of emotions. The development of social emotional skills is instrumental for children in order to develop close, satisfying relationships with other children and adults. It gives children the ability to learn and explore their environment through relationships and interactions. Children who develop strong social emotional skills tend to be happier, more motivated to learn, and perform better academically.

Skills children learn throughout social emotional development are important as children learn to manage emotions, interact and create relationships with others, and begin to feel/show empathy to those around them. When interacting with children, it is important to model these skills in order to promote the growth and development of them in children.

How we perceive and define children's social emotional development will in turn effect how we respond and connect with them. Modeling these skills can look like:

- Calm, positive, consistent, and age appropriate responses
- Playing and interacting with children down on their level
- Provide opportunity for choice (this promotes a positive sense of self)
- Approaching mistakes as an opportunity to learn

Now what?

Communication = Success! The best outcome for children's social emotional development happens when the childcare staff and parents work together for the good of the child. What does this mean? Communicate. The communication partnership between providers and parents is vital for success to ensure consistent care for the child between home and day care settings. Take time to discuss what is going well both at home and in the classroom and new ideas to address challenging outbursts. It is important for providers and parents to collaboratively communicate regarding the care of a child to promote trust, teamwork, and consistency. Providers should consider asking questions like:

- What is your child's favorite/least favorite activity?
- What do you do to encourage your child to use positive behaviors?
- How do you handle and manage outbursts at home?

Keep in Mind

The development of a child's social emotional skills is not 'one size fits all'. Each child is unique and will have their own way of understanding themselves and interacting with the world. A child's characteristics and personality will affect their path to social emotional development. Be aware each child will respond differently to interactions and take notice what those reactions are like. Use those observations to guide interactions with the child to assist them in experiencing, managing, and learning to express their own emotions. Just like the ABC's children are not expected to learn these skills overnight, be consistent.

ADULT, CHILD & INFANT CPR/AED

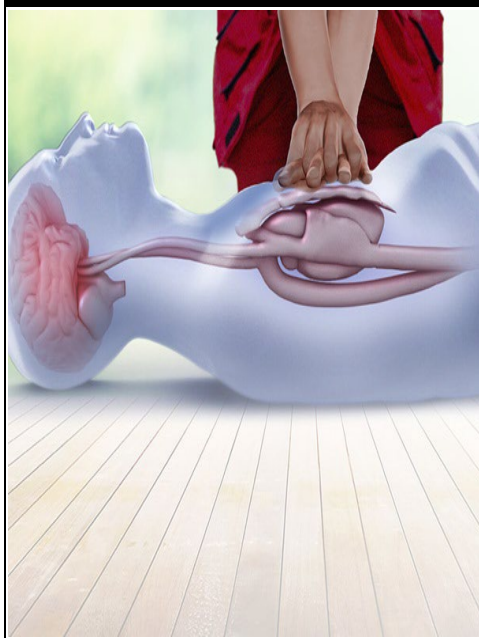

Online CPR Training Option

Providers have an option to complete the education portion online and conduct face to face skill testing in Sioux Falls.

Below is the process to conduct the education portion online and skill testing face to face in Sioux Falls:

- Contact us to receive the online course link
- Complete the online course
- Contact our office to schedule 1:1 skill testing. Certificate of completion of online course must be brought to skill testing.
- After completion of the online course, you will have 60 days to complete the face-to-face skill testing portion

CPR Class Policy

CPR classes sponsored by the City of Sioux Falls Health Department through Sanford CHILD Services are provided free of charge to Sioux Falls City registered family day care providers and their helpers.

Registration for CPR classes is limited to 9 people per class. To help ensure CPR education is available throughout the year to Sioux Falls City registered family day care providers, the following policy exists:

1. Class registration is limited to Sioux Falls city registered family day care providers and their helpers.
2. Sioux Falls City registered providers, and their helpers, receive one free CPR class per year.

CPR Cancellation Policy

Cancellation of CPR class registration needs to be made 24 hours prior to the start of the CPR class. By doing so, allows others to enroll in the CPR class.

1. If notice of cancellation is not received 24 hours prior to the CPR class, the registrant will have used up his/her free CPR class for the year. A payment of \$20 will be needed to enroll in another City of Sioux Falls Health Department sponsored CPR class.

CPR & Certified First Aid Registration & Payment Policy

Certified First Aid & CPR reservation is not confirmed until payment is received. If payment has not been received 24 hours prior to the start of the class, this class reservation will be given to the first participant that secures this reservation with a payment.

CPR & Certified First Aid Class Refund Policy

Class cancellation is required prior to the start of class, otherwise payment will be forfeited and is non-transferrable.
